Nice continuation to "Cult Movies" volume 1By Privacy, PleaseAfter writing "Cult Movies" volume 1 that contained essays and photos describing and discussing 100 cult movies from the 30s to the 70s, Danny Peary followed up with this volume 2, which follows the same fun format but covers only 50 additional movies. The time frame of this volume also spans the 30s through the 70s, with maybe a couple of early 80s movies having snuck in there, and contains all genres - crime/ noir, sci-fi, horror, midnight movies, musicals etc. Even if you have seen some of these movies (for instance, "Taxi Driver", "Mommie Dearest" and "Monty Python and the Holy Grail" are not exactly rarities), the analyses are sure to point out some aspects of the movie or how it was made that you didn't know about or hadn't seen before. Having read this in the pre-Internet days, I wasn't aware, for example, that there were so many different cuts of

"The Wicker Man". I gave it 4 rather than 5 stars only because I was sorry this volume was so short compared to Volume 1. It only contains essays on 50 movies, compared to 100 in Volume 1, but even beyond that, for some reason it managed to be 100 pages shorter than Volume 3, which also covered only 50 movies but managed to fill many more pages. I am not sure how this happened but I did wish this Volume 2 was longer.

Listing fifty more favorite cult movies, CULT MOVIES 2 starts with "Altered States" and ends with "Zardoz", giving a synopsis of the movie plot and including scene photos for most if not all titles. All movies listed include names of directors, producers, music, cinematography, screenplay, actors, etc.
