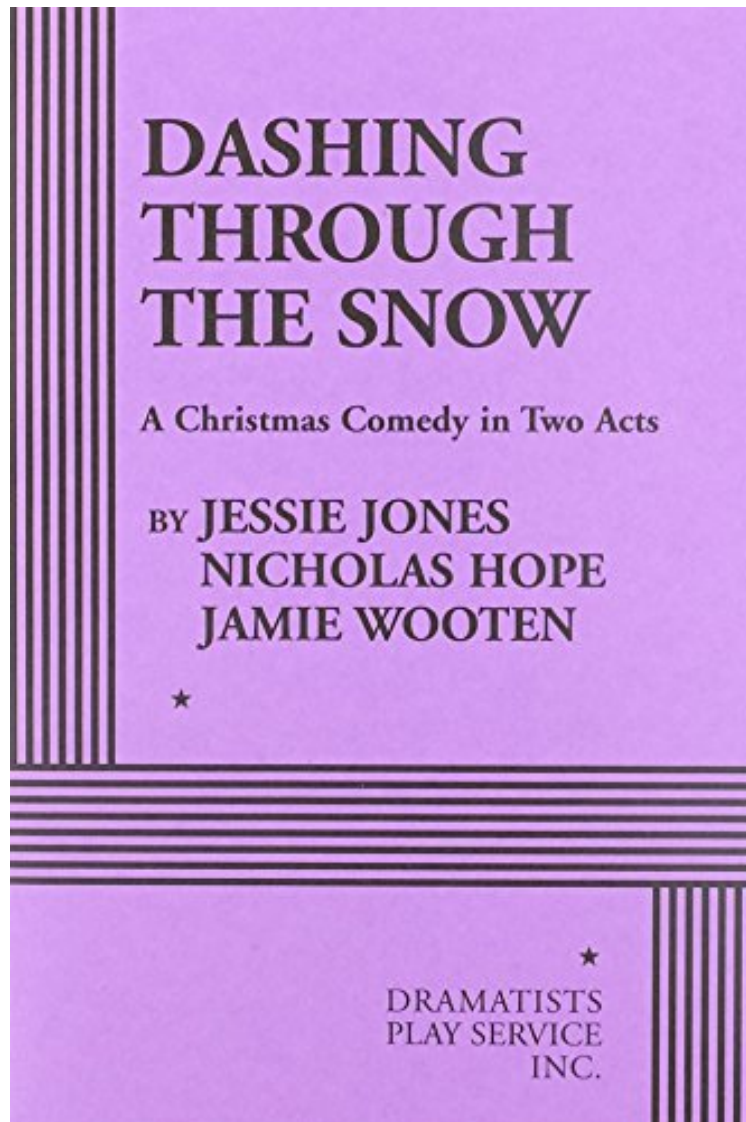

I just finished portraying one of the characters in a local production of "Dashing Through the Snow." I really enjoyed reading and then performing this play. It's about a small bed and breakfast in rural Texas, its harried owner, and the wild cards that come through town to stay there around the Christmas holiday. Each scene contains different characters, which provide four humorous vignettes. My favorite scene is the third scene, when two bombastic actors arrive to spread ashes near the BB.
