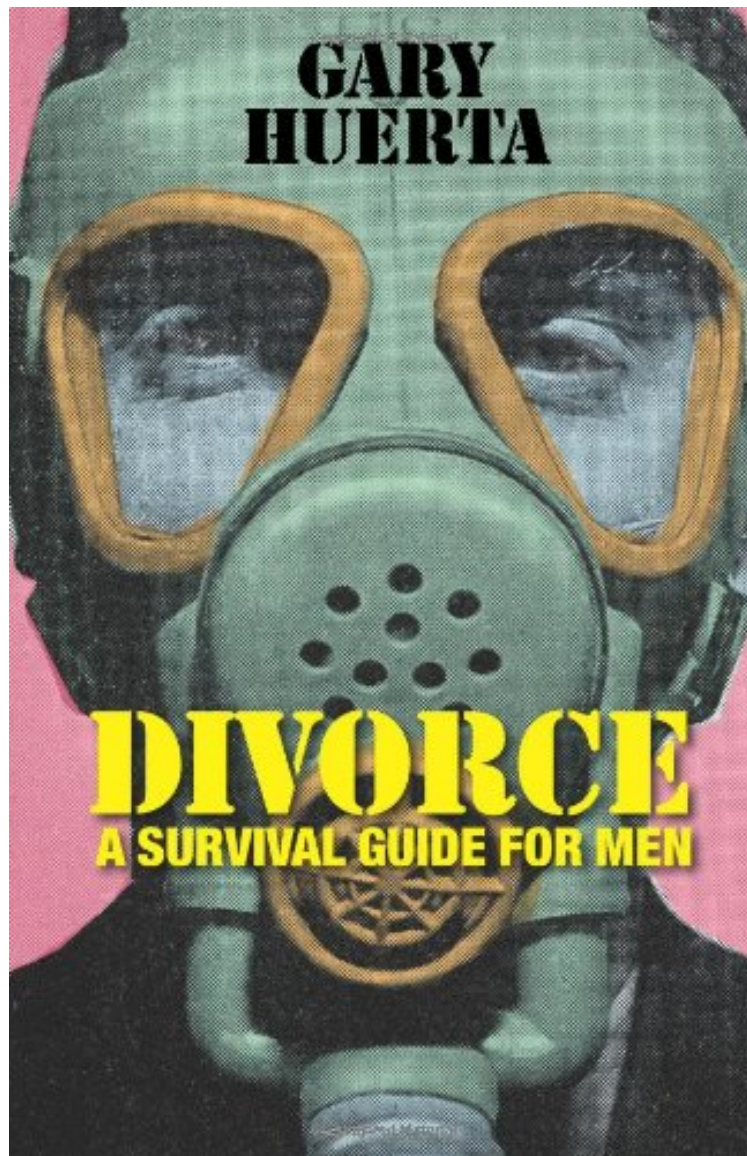

A poignant, sad, and darkly humorous readBy dlacy"Divorce: A Survival Guide for Men" serves a dual purpose: As a memoir of sorts for author Gary Huerta and as a literal handbook for men navigating the rocky waters of divorce. At times Huerta's tone -- deeply cynical and jaded -- seems excessive and uncomfortably inappropriate. But as he masterfully lays his own life to bare for anyone who chooses to read one quickly discovers that a.) he has more than ample reason for the "wall" and b.) he's incredibly self-deprecating. The latter discovery is not based solely on his own apologies and admissions of fault that overtly declare his culpability in the marriage's dissolution, but also in his sometimes nearly slapstick anecdotes (SPOILER ALERT: Gary attends his own wedding high as a kite). Here is a man who is flawed and who is not afraid to both tell you and show you this fact, even if at times you cringe. Yet the real cringing is saved for the vindictive tales of his "ex-wife," who seems to make it her mission in life to undermine Gary by any means possible. Actually, "undermine" is a serious "understatement"; she manipulates him, abuses the legal system, and most egregiously, steers one of their children against him (over what should in fact, be a rather trivial matter.) Gary's own story is interwoven with very applicable advice for men (or women for that matter who may somehow find themselves being bullied by an ex through the legal system). He provides useful advice for everything from government forms to post-marriage communication (be it via telephone, e-mail, or in person, in court). Many have oft compared divorce to a death of a loved one and in the end Huerta's "Divorce" is indeed a tragedy. Throughout the screw-ups and comical side stories a narrative of sadness unravels rapidly. Yet the tragedy concludes with a unique catharsis, and the very clear/specific manual suddenly becomes a Choose Your Own Adventure at the end. Of course, the adventure is the life of the reader (and the writer) and the sad prologue is un-erasable.

You've probably heard the old saying, Never bring a knife to a gun fight. Well, in divorce, gun play is the least of your problems. This field manual contains the information you need to get through your divorce relatively intact. Each chapter provides a rule necessary to negotiate and subdue an estranged wife, her psychotic attorney and a family court system bent on shriveling your manhood to a permanently flacid state. For the unmarried grunts, there are even a few pre-emptive guidelines, which can be weaponized as a deterrent. Even if you only use a few of the 37 rules within, you could save yourself years of torture. When that happens, this book will have paid for itself a thousand times over. For every man considering matrimony, already married, or thinking about driving his wife out to the Mojave Desert and leaving her to fend for herself - this book is for you.
