For a while, I was unsure if it was an expanded update of the first volume or a different set of films because I was seeing a great number of titles missing from the book. Sadly to say, too many films mentioned were actually not good and not worth watching. For a long time volume 2 was out-of-print and people were asking absurd prices for it. This is one to get before it's gone -- the reviews are just right, in my opinion. They tell enough about the movie to get you interested, without giving away the entire plot (much as I love the Overlook encyclopedia series for their wealth of information, they spoil the story for you every time!), and more to the point get you interested in these movies. So I recommend you get all 4 volumes, if available -- now. Volume 3 has the best index (to the first three combined), while this and the others have sort of compressed indices of the other volumes, which are hard for me to make out. Some really entertaining reviews here -- I could enjoy it without watching the movies, but these four volumes have compelled me to buy about a hundred DVDs! Highly recommended.
