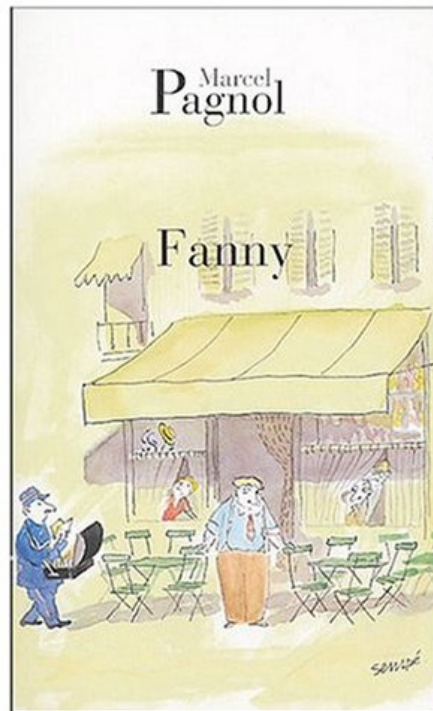

Yes, it's full of coincidences, but they add to its spirit, which is playful, fun, and unapologetic. I found the style to be the opposite of pretentious. Warning: the sex and violence are as over-the-top as the great catalogues of other details in evidence everywhere. Despite a few cringes, I spent most of my reading experience smiling or laughing. Once in a while, you can tell that a writer's work was both a labor of love and an indulgence in sheer fun. This is one of those books. The heroine is a mix of "Forever" Amber (yes, from a much earlier period, and don't pretend you didn't love her) Tom Jones, Moll Flanders, and Becky Sharp. The world she inhabits surfaces in endless catalogues of quirky period details, and she navigates it surrounded by a gaggle of rogues Thackeray and Collins would have admired. Yes, it has a Neoclassical setting, and Jong's knowledge of the period and its slang are in full evidence here. The comedic spirit of that age that was kept alive in the next century is evident as well. Treat
