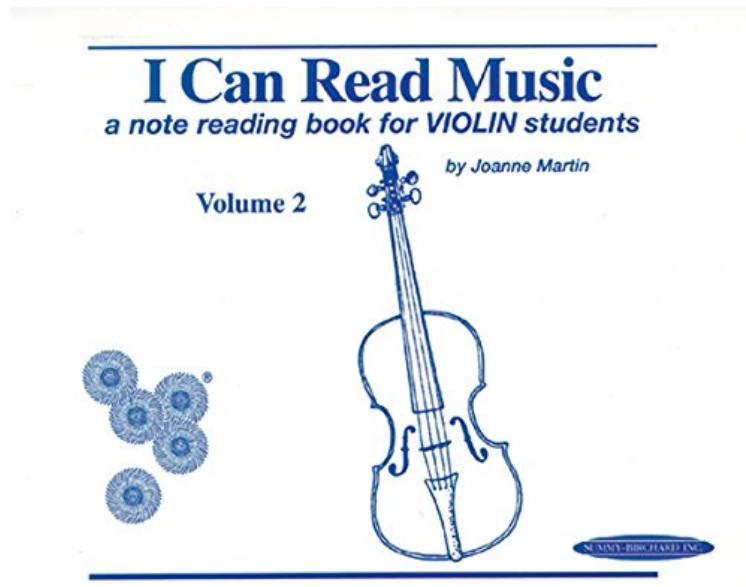

The first volume was perfect - no issues but this one has very flimsy binding that quickly separates itself from the pages of the book so I'm disappointed. 0 of 0 people found the following review helpful. Volume II for Violin. By Kara A. I really loved vol. 1. This vol. 2 is formatted differently. Rhythms and note theory are mixed in each lesson, instead of being separate like in vol. 1. There is one lesson per page. There are 100 lessons. There is a very good reference section at the beginning. The finger placements for each scale is shown in a diagram, which is really helpful. Be careful of the pages. Other reviewers said they are fragile. The paper in the one I bought seems pretty heavy weight so perhaps that has been corrected. After carefully replacing the pages for weeks on end, I finally took the book to work with me and rebound it with a plastic binding comb whose holes fortunately lined up with the metal binding comb holes.

These easy-to-read, progressive exercises by Joanne Martin develop a student's reading skills one stage at a time, with many repetitions at each stage. I Can Read Music is designed as a first note-reading book for students of string

instruments who have learned to play using an aural approach such as the Suzuki Method, or for traditionally taught students who need extra note reading practice. Its presentation of new ideas is clear enough that it can be used daily at home by quite young children and their parents, with the teacher checking progress every week or two.
